We will continue to provide <u>a free breakfast for every child</u> arriving at school to ensure the best start to their day.

Attendance and Punctuality

It is important that every child arrives at school on time and ready to learn each day. There is a clear link between poor attendance and punctuality and the impact this has on a child's progress and attainment. As a school, we have some way to go in improving a significant number of pupils' attendance. During your parent consultation meeting, we will be sharing your child(rens) attendance and punctuality for this academic year. Thank you for every effort you have taken for your child(ren) to arrive on time and be in school for every day they are well enough to attend.

Moving into 2023/24, we ask that you work with us to ensure your child does not miss any learning time by being on time and in school every day.

<u>Uniform & a FREE PE kit for every child:</u>

In support of all families, children will be issued with a free PE kit in September which will be a tshirt and a pair of jogging pants per child. Children are expected to come to school in PE kit on their











PE days (these will be shared with you by class teachers when we return in September) Kits will be given to children once back in school in September. Children will only be issued with one kit, so if it is lost or your child grows out of it, families will need to purchase new PE Kit.

We want to support every family in terms of being able to access affordable uniform, if you would like further information or to talk to us about any aspect of uniform – please don't hesitate to make an appointment via our main school office.

School Dinners - School Money payments

Thank you to all of you who are prompt in making dinner payments. The cost of a school meal is increasing slightly to £2.12 per day for children in Nursery and £2.46 for children in Year 3 to Year 6.

Please can we take this opportunity to remind you that our expectation is that all meals are paid for weekly and in advance, on the Monday for the week ahead. We will continue to contact any parents with any money owing and your prompt attention in this matter will be greatly appreciated. Any balances remaining unpaid by the beginning of the new academic year, will be passed to Leeds City Council for collection, which could result in you paying more through further charges/administration costs

Free School Meals

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- income support
- income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- the guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

Universal Infant Free School Meals

All children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, will automatically get free school meals through the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme. Parents/carers do not need to make an application to receive these meals. If you receive benefits and your child already gets Universal Infant Free School













Meals, please can we ask that you still register for free school meals. This enables us to claim funding to support your child at school through Pupil Premium.

If your child is moving into Year 3, the Universal Infant Free School Meal scheme comes to an end, so you will need to start paying for meals unless your child qualifies for free meals through any benefits you are in receipt of.

<u>Milk at School</u>

For Key Stage 1 & Key Stage 2 children, the system for ordering milk is explained on our school website, please follow the link: <u>https://www.hunsletmoor.co.uk/parents-and-carers/school-meals</u> Nursery and Children under 5 in Reception receive milk each day free of charge.

If your child qualifies for Free School Meals through benefit eligibility, you can also receive milk free of charge. Please contact the <u>School Office</u> .
