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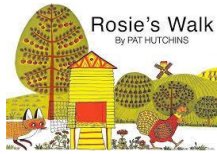
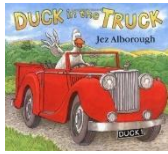
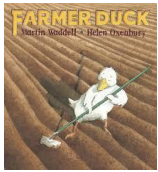
Welcome Back to Nursery!

This half term our topic is 'On the Farm'. Through this topic we will be developing our Knowledge and understanding of the world around us. We are very excited to be going on a trip to Wigfield Farm to enrich our learning and we hope that your child will get lots from this learning experience.

Curriculum coverage

This half term our key text will be –



Lots of our learning will be linked to these books and we will cover objectives from across the curriculum to develop your child's skills. Children should be working in the 3-4 year old age band. Below are some of the objectives we will work on.

Communication and Language:

Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.

Develop their communication and use longer sentences of four to six words.

Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.

Use talk to organise themselves and their play.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Following expectations without needing reminding.

I know the names for some parts of my body and am starting to understand that I need to be active to be healthy

Tell you some of the things I need to do to be healthy

Know what the word 'healthy' means and that some foods are healthier than others

Know why I need to brush my teeth every day

I can wash my hands and know it is important to do this before I eat and after I go to the toilet

Physical Development

Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.

Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.

Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

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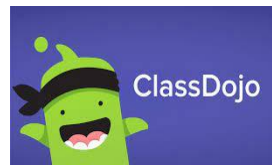
Wigfield Farm trip
