On 6th February 2022

The Coronation

On 6th February 1952, when Elizabeth was 25 years old, her father King George VI died.



When she heard the news, she returned to England from Kenya. She had been completing a royal tour instead of her father because he was too ill to travel.

The new queen chose Elizabeth II to be her name during her reign.

She was crowned in Westminster Abbey on 2nd June 1953.

The Royal Coronation was a world-wide celebration. Over 20 million people watched the ceremony on television.

When is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee?



The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations are taking place all year-round but the official date that she reached her anniversary was the 6th February 2022.

Last weekend on June 2nd was the anniversary of the day she was crowned at Westminster Abbey.

Queen Elizabeth II's Reign

During her reign, Queen Elizabeth II has travelled all over the world, visiting many countries in the Commonwealth.

The Commonwealth is a collection of 54 countries. Some of these countries used to be part of the British Empire.

When Queen Elizabeth was crowned queen in the United Kingdom, she also became the monarch for some of these Commonwealth countries.

The Queen does not control the British government but she meets with the prime minister once a week to discuss what is happening in the country.

Her dedication to her role as queen, representing her family and her country, is often remarked upon.



What is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee?

This year is Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. A jubilee is an anniversary of a King or Queen and how long they have ruled.

25 years is silver, 50 years golden and 60 years diamond.

The Queen has been on the throne for 70 years and will be the first British monarch (King or Queen) to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee.

The jubilee is being celebrated this year all across the UK and the Commonwealth.

The Titanic was found by Robert Ballard and he was a doctor. The Titanic was built in Ireland from 1909 to 1912 on the hulls of the British super white Star line the Titanic officially left the coast on the 15th of April from St John's F.R. Ireland on April 11 1912 carrying over 2200 passengers and crew the great

The wreckage found!

There were 1000 million rich and poor people going to the Titanic. One day there came a iceberg which was bigger than the Titanic. A star the sinking on April 15 1912 the great ship slumbered on the floor of the Atlantic Ocean for over 70 years before its wreckage was discovered.

Ship began its maiden voyage across the Atlantic headed for New York. The immediate cause of RMS Titanic demise was a collision with an iceberg that caused the ocean liner to sink on April 14-15 1912. While the ship could reportedly stay afloat.

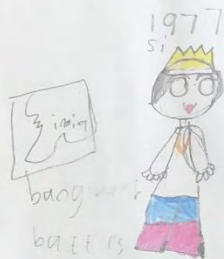

Fields of debris surrounded each part of the wreck. Robt Dr. Robert Ballard found the Titanic and suggested his idea. Titanic was built by a company called White Star line.

Biography

Martin Luther King, Jr. was a civil rights activist in the 1950s and 1960s. He led non-violent protests to fight for rights of all people including ~~Americans~~ ^{African} Americans. He hoped that America and the world could form a society.

Where did Martin grow up?

Martin Luther King, Jr. was born in Atlanta, GA on January 15, 1929. He went to Booker T. Washington High School. He was so smart that he skipped 2 grades/years in High School. He started his college education at Morehouse, Atlanta.

How did he get involved in civil rights?

In his first major civil rights actions, Martin Luther King, Jr. led the Montgomery Bus Boycott. This started when Rosa Parks refused to give up her ^{seat} ~~chair~~ on a bus to a white man. She was arrested and spent the night in jail.

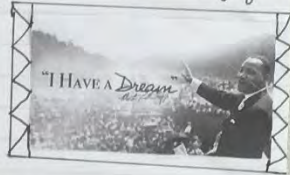
Martin Luther King, Junior

Martin Luther King Jr was a Civil rights leader in the 1950-60. He was a peaceful man who wanted America to form a Society where race wouldn't have a Impact on a persons civil right.

He was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta. Unfortunately, he died April 4th 1968 in Memphis. He is known for Advancing the Civil rights Movement and his "I have a dream speech". Many of his speeches still inspire to this day.

Where he grew up?

Martin Luther King Jr was born in Atlanta. He went to Booker T Highschool. Martin was so smart that he skipped two GRADES. He started College at the age of 15! After getting a degree in Sociology at Morehouse college, he got a divinity degree from Crozer Seminary and then Martin got a doctors degree from Boston University. His dad was a preacher which inspired Martin to pursue the ministry. He had a younger Brother and a young older sister. In 1953 he married Coretta Scott. Later they had four kids: Yolanda, Martin, Dexter and Bernice.

His "I Have a dream" Speech

In 1963 Martin Luther King Jr organized the "March on Washington". Over 250,000 people came! This speech is one of the most famous speeches in history. The civil right act passed in 1964.

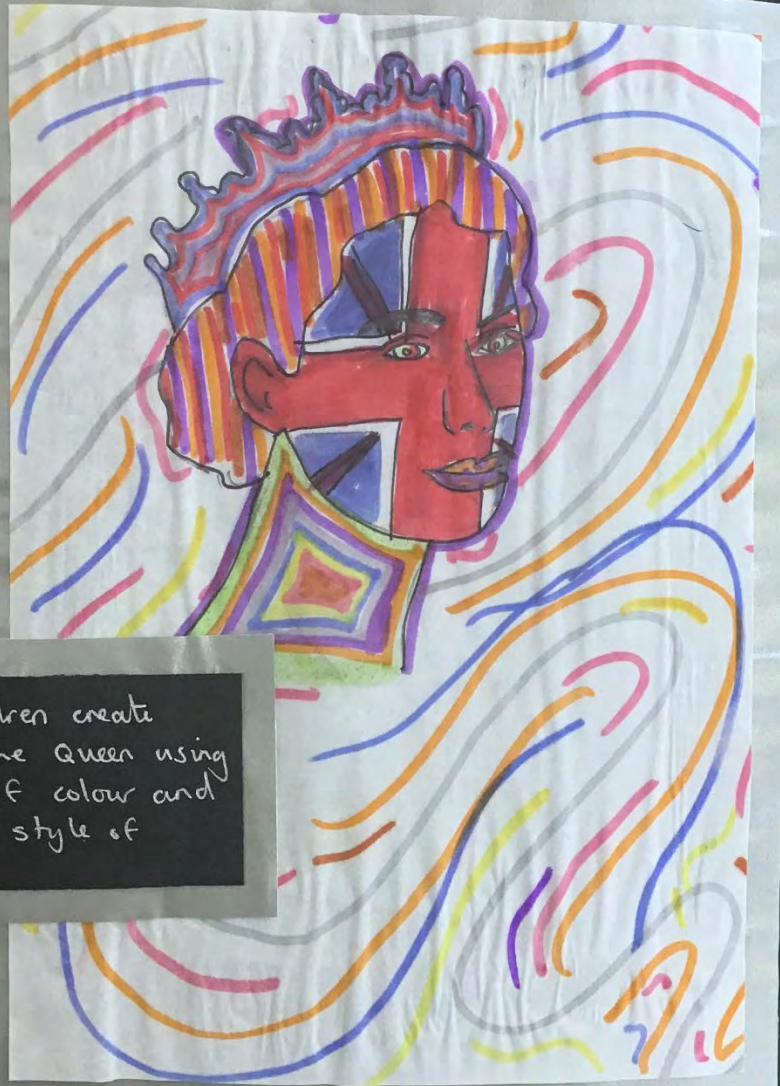

QUEEN'S CORONATION

The coronation of Elizabeth II took place on 2 June 1953 at Westminster Abbey in London. Elizabeth II acceded to the throne at the age of 25 upon the death of her father, George VI, on 6 Feb 1952, being proclaimed queen by her privy and executive councils shortly afterwards.

QUEEN'S CORONATION

The coronation was held more than one year later because of the tradition of allowing an appropriate length of time to pass after a monarch dies before holding such a ceremony.

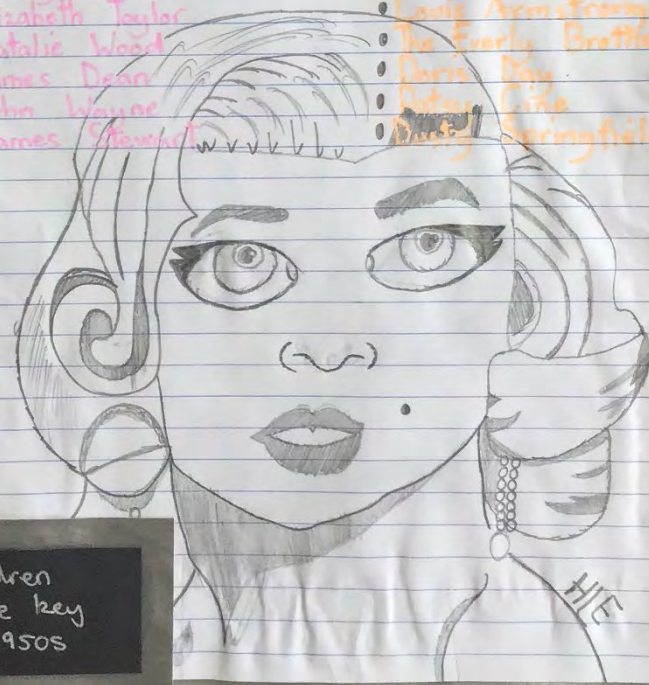

Coronation of 1952...



Queen Elizabeth II found out that her father died because Prince Philip convinced her to take a walk and that's when she heard the devastating news. The Queen was not coronated until 16 months later, because she had to mourn her father's death. King George VI (may you rest in peace) failed to recover from lung disease and died in his sleep at Sandringham he was aged 56. Queen Elizabeth I died at the age 101 (may she rest in peace) of old age.

The Queen was coronated on 6th February 1952. She was coronated at Westminster Abbey in London. She was the 39th sovereign to be crowned at Westminster Abbey. She was only 25 years old when she was coronated. Winston Churchill wanted to delay the coronation because the forces were forcing him to resign his job to someone else.

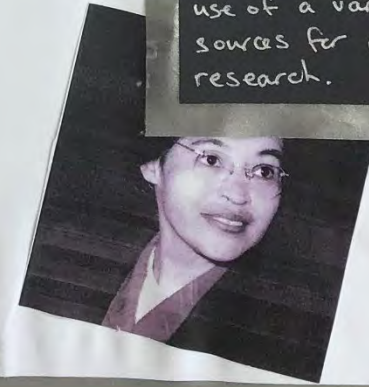
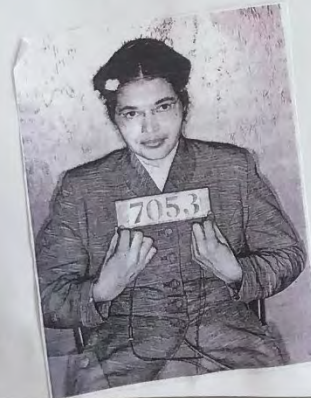


ROSA PARKS!

Rosa Parks' stand off with Alabama bus driver in 1955 turned into a wider movement that fought against segregation and inequality.

This was not her first run-in with Blake as, in 1943, he kicked her off his bus for entering through the front door rather than the back. The others got up; Parks remained seated. She wasn't physically tired, as was claimed afterwards, but tired of giving in.

Parks had been a passionate activist and member of the national association for the Advancement of Colored people (NAACP) for years already, and knew consequences of her refusal for more. She was arrested when she was 42 years old.
