Substantive Knowledge

- Although telephones were around 100 years ago (within living memory) they were very different and only rich people had them in their homes.
- Old toys were simple and expensive. They were most often made of wood and handmade.
- Early computers were the size of rooms, they did not have screens or keyboards and were used for hard maths problems. Computers could not talk to each other.
- The first mobile phones were invented in 1973. The batteries were so big you had to carry them around in a bag.
- Clive Sinclair invented the world's first home computer, the ZX80 in 1980. This allowed children to play the first, very simple computer games.
- Sir Tim Berners-Lee invented the world wide web (not the internet) in 1989 as a way for scientists to share their work with each other.
- The world's first website was made in 1991.
- Smartphones first appeared in 1992. The iPhone was launched by Steve Jobs at Apple in 2007.
