Substantive Knowledge

- Julius Caesar, failed to invade Britain twice in 55BCE
- Claudius successfully invaded Britain in 43CE
- Boudicca was an Iceni leader who led a Celt rebellion against the Roman invaders.
- The Romans built Long, straight roads across the empire. They helped move armies quickly and let trade travel across long distances. Some of these roads still survive today
- The Romans built new towns. They had a grid structure and featured a forum, basilica and public baths.
- Emperor Hadrian built a wall in 122AD, between modern England and Scotland as the northern border of the empire. It was 120 km coast to coast and kept Scotland (Caledonia) out.
- The Roman Empire lasted for 400 years in Britain. The Roman army left in 410CE to defend other parts of the Empire.
