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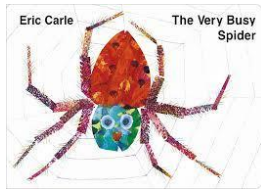
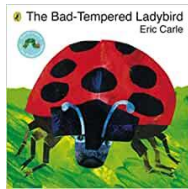
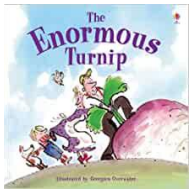
Welcome Back to Nursery!

We hope that you have had a lovely half term holiday!

This half term our topic is Nature Detectives. We will be learning about lots of different plants and animals and exploring things in the natural environment. We are very excited to be going on a trip to Tropical world to enrich our learning and we hope that your child will get lots from this learning experience.

Curriculum coverage

This half term our key text will be –



Lots of our learning will be linked to these books and we will cover objectives from across the curriculum to develop your child's skills. Children should be working in the 3-4 year old age band. Below are some of the objectives we will work on.

Communication and Language:

Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.

Develop their communication and use longer sentences of four to six words.

Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.

Use talk to organise themselves and their play.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.

Understand gradually how others might be feeling.

Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.

Talk with others to solve conflicts.

Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs.

Physical Development

Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.

Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.

Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.
